Constitution of the Rational Governance Alliance

Preamble: We, the founders and members of the Rational Governance Alliance, establish this constitution to foster a new era of governance that harnesses the power of artificial intelligence while preserving human values and democratic principles.

Article I: Purpose and Mission The RGA exists to:

- 1. Promote and support the implementation of Rationally Bound Delegate (RBD) systems at all levels of governance.
- 2. Develop and maintain open-source AI models for governance.
- 3. Educate the public about Al-enhanced decision-making in governance.
- 4. Ensure the ethical use of AI in public administration.

Article II: Organizational Structure

- 1. Trust:
 - The RGA shall operate as a Wyoming Purpose Trust as outlined in the trust document.
- 2. Trustee:
 - A single Trustee shall manage the day-to-day operations of the RGA.
- 3. Enforcer:
 - The Enforcer shall ensure the Trustee adheres to the Trust's purpose and foundational documents.
- 4. Advisory Council:
 - Experts in AI, ethics, governance, and related fields
 - o Provides guidance on technical and ethical matters

Article III: Rationally Bound Delegates (RBDs)

- Definition: RBDs are individuals who commit to deferring 100% of their decision-making to AI systems, serving as the necessary human interface in our current legal and social framework.
- Certification: The Trustee shall be responsible for certifying RBDs and ensuring their continued compliance with RBD principles.
- 3. Support: The RGA shall provide comprehensive support to RBDs, including training, technical support, and campaign assistance.
- 4. Income Sharing: RBDs shall enter into income sharing agreements with the Trust as outlined in the trust document.

Article IV: Decision-Making

- 1. Trustee Decisions: The Trustee shall make operational decisions in line with the Trust's purpose.
- 2. Enforcer Oversight: The Enforcer shall have the power to remove and replace the Trustee if necessary.
- 3. Al Arbitration: In case of disagreement between the Enforcer and Trustee, an Al system may be used for arbitration.

Article V: AI Systems

- 1. Open Source: All Al systems used by the RGA shall be open-source and transparent.
- 2. Continuous Improvement: The RGA shall continuously update and improve its Al systems.
- 3. Ethical Framework: All Al systems shall adhere to a strict ethical framework.

Article VI: Transparency and Reporting

- 1. Public Registry: The RGA shall maintain a public registry of all certified RBDs.
- 2. Annual Report: The RGA shall publish an annual report detailing its activities and financial status.
- 3. Al Repository: A public repository of all Al systems and decision-making processes shall be maintained.

Article VII: Amendments

- 1. Proposal: Amendments may be proposed by the Trustee or Enforcer.
- 2. Approval: Amendments must be approved jointly by the Trustee and Enforcer.

Article VIII: Dissolution

- Conditions: The RGA may only be dissolved if its purpose becomes impossible to fulfill.
- 2. Process: Dissolution must be determined by the Enforcer and confirmed by a court of competent jurisdiction.
